We are buying in a couple loads of dry hay to get our cows through the summer pasture slump. The grass just needs rain...

We have put an effort into setting up a self serve farm stand. We will be offering cherries, green beans, lettuces and a few other items. We are running the stand through the afternoons.

For those with market share accounts, just leave your name and amount spent on a slip of paper, put into the payment slot at the stand and we will debit your account. Not a very fancy solution, but we hope it works. We also accept checks or cash. If you want to pick up meat just call me when you get there and someone will come help you.
